 Another name given to Esau, son of Isaac. The descendants of Esau (**Edom**) took over the area of Seir, the mountainous region between the Dead Sea and the Gulf of Aqaba. It became known as **Edom**. (Ge 25:30; 36:8)—See App. B3 and B4.

OBADIAH, BOOK OF The shortest prophetic book of the Hebrew Scriptures. Written by Obadiah (concerning whom nothing but the name is known), this book contains a proclamation of Jehovah's judgment against **Edom**, presents the reason for that judgment, and points forward to restoration for "the house of Jacob." The extinction of the Edomites as a people and the restoration of the Israelites to their land confirm the accurate fulfillment of Obadiah's prophecy.—Ob 17, 18; see **EDOM, EDMOMITES**.

PEULLETHAI (Pe-ulle'-thai) [from a root meaning "wages"]. The eighth of Obed-**edom's** sons, listed as a gatekeeper.—1Ch 26:1, 4, 5, 15.

IRAM (I'ram) [possibly from a root meaning "full-grown ass"]. A sheik or chieftain of Esau (**Edom**).—Ge 36:43; 1Ch 1:54.

Hor
HOR [Heb., Hor ha-har', "Hor the Mountain"]. 1. The mountain near Moserah on the border of **Edom** where Aaron died shortly before Israel's entry into the Promised Land. With the assembly of Israel watching, Aaron, Moses, and Aaron's son Eleazar ascended Mount Hor. On the mountaintop Moses removed Aaron's priestly garments and clothed Eleazar with them. After this, Aaron died, and Moses and Eleazar probably buried him there.—Nu 20:22-29; De 32:50; compare De 10:6.

OMAR (O'mar) [from a root meaning "say"]. Second-listed son of Esau's firstborn Eliphaz; a sheik of **Edom**.—Ge 36:10, 11, 15; 1Ch 1:36.

ALVAH (Al'vah). A sheik of **Edom** and descendant of Esau. (Ge 36:40, 43; 1Ch 1:51) Possibly a place and a tribe were also called Alvah.—See **TIMNA** No. 3.

SAMLAH (Sam'lah). The fifth-named king of **Edom** who reigned before a king ruled Israel. Samlah was from Masrekah.—Ge 36:31-37; 1Ch 1:47, 48.

MIKNEIAH (Mik-ne'iah) [Herds (Livestock) of Jehovah]. One of the Levites who played harps while the Ark was transported from the house of Obed-**edom** to Jerusalem.—1Ch 15:17, 18, 21.

MEZAHAB (Me'za-hab) [Waters of Gold]. Parent of Matred and ancestor (perhaps, ancestress) of Mehetabel, the wife of Hadar (Hadad), the last named of the kings of **Edom**.—Ge 36:31, 39; 1Ch 1:50.

DIMONAH (Di-mo'nah). A southern city of Judah near the border of **Edom**. (Jos 15:21, 22) It is suggested by some to be the same as "Dibon" mentioned at Nehemiah 11:25, but its exact location remains uncertain.
